**Wakulla County Supervisor of Elections Reminds Voters of the Early Voting Schedule for the 2024 Presidential Preference Primary Election.**

**Wakulla County, FL** – Joe Morgan, Supervisor of Elections for Wakulla County, reminds voters of the upcoming Early Voting schedule for the March 19<sup>th</sup> Presidential Preference Primary Election. “Starting on Saturday, March 9<sup>th</sup>, and running through Saturday, March 16<sup>th</sup>, Wakulla County voters can cast ballots for the Presidential Preference Primary Election at both Early Voting locations,” said Supervisor Morgan. “This year, we hope more voters will choose our new location, the Riversink Fire Station located at 491 Crawfordville Hwy. It is a great site, and we hope more people take advantage of this second location,” said Morgan.

Voters can also drop-off a Vote-by-Mail ballot at any Early Voting site during voting hours. Each site has a secure ballot intake station staffed by an election worker, so voters can return their Vote-by-Mail ballots without needed postage. Vote-by-Mail ballots must be received by the Elections Office by 7 p.m. on Election Day, March 19<sup>th</sup>, for the ballot to be counted.
