BY MAIL

Want to Vote By Mail?

For your convenience, any registered voter may vote by mail. To request a Vote by Mail ballot, you must provide the information we have on file for you such as your FL ID#, FL DL# or the last 4 digits of your Social Security Number. One request can cover you through the upcoming General Election.

Call the Elections Office at (850) 926-7575.

Requests for vote by mail ballots must be made 10 days prior to Election Day for ballot to be mailed. All vote by mail ballots must be in the Supervisor's Office by 7 p.m. on Election Day, in order to count.

Signature Update

Any time there is a change in your signature or identifying "mark", you must complete a new registration application & submit it to the Elections Office. If your signature on your voter record and the signature on your vote by mail ballot do not match, your vote by mail ballot will not count.

How To MAKE YOUR VOTE COUNT

Our tabulation system uses an optical scanner to read your ballot.

You must completely fill in the oval for your vote to count.
